Brian Bittner (Baltimore City Local)
Candidate for National Co Chair, Socialist Party USA

I am asking for your vote and support as a National Chair of the SPUSA. For the last two years I have served as a National Vice-Chair, where I've shown up consistently and tried to do my best to build the Socialist Party. I would prioritize three main goals as a National Chair:

1. Communicating on behalf of the party. I've authored many of the party's statements of the past year in opposition to the Trump administration. Last year I completed a Master's degree in Communication, concentrating in Political Communication. I want to be a Chair who can represent the party in writing, on podcasts, in videos, and in the new media that continues to develop.
2. Building local chapters. I helped form the local chapter in Baltimore and serve on its Local Executive Committee. I will work with any new local chapter in any town or city, but I think our national party leadership should spend some time focusing on forming strong local chapters in our biggest cities – Los Angeles, Chicago, and New York City. We also need to build a symbolic local presence in the District of Columbia, our nation's capital. From Baltimore, I can assist in-person when needed in DC and NYC, and will work remotely to help any other growing local chapter.
3. Contesting elections. I revitalized our federal committee – the Socialist National Committee – that financially supported our sole local candidate in last year's election and is fundraising now to support more local candidates. I served as the Treasurer for our 2024 Presidential ticket, and after the

campaign I formed the Ballot Access and Electoral Working Group to help continue supporting candidates and efforts to access ballots.

I live in north Baltimore with my partner and our eight (!) cats. I hope that the party can bring an upcoming national convention to Baltimore, so we can begin meeting face to face again. Organizing an in-person convention with a good online hybrid option will be a challenge, but I know that we can do it! I work as an administrator at a local university, so I know how to keep materials organized and stay up to date on new electronic tools. I previously worked for almost a decade in a national political office in DC.
